## **Mural Painting**




A mural is any piece of artwork painted or applied directly on a wall, ceiling, or other large permanent surface.


 Architectural elements are harmoniously incorporated into the picture.



- Murals date as far back as 30,000 B.C.
- Survived in Egyptian tombs (c. 3150 B.C.)



- Murals existed throughout classical antiquity (Renaissance and Baroque eras)
- Fresco was the traditional medium
  - Paint is applied to wet plaster
  - -Chemical reaction fixes the pigment particles in the plaster
  - Can last up to centuies





 Northern Ireland contains some of the most famous political murals in the world






- The Berlin Wall stood from 1961 1989

Keith Haring, an American graffiti artis, painted on the Berlin Wall as a protes to human rights violations.





### Graffiti

- Used as a memoir of innocent lives lost to inner city violence
- Also expresses underlying social and political messages
- Evolved along with hip hop culture
- Gangs used graffiti to mark their territory
